

2009 Construction season underway!

With the mild spring weather and summer just around the corner, the construction season has begun to pick up. Many homeowners are getting ready to put their winter plans into action and start their summer building projects. Residential permits have steadily increased since the first of the year and a strong commercial building industry continues as well. Mahoning County Building Inspection is ready to assist contractors and homeowners in obtaining their permits and provide the required inspections for the work being done.

Why do I need a permit?

Building permits provide a means for the Code Official to protect the public from unsafe and unsanitary conditions resulting from substandard construction. Not only does this maintain the value of your home, but also others within our community. Building codes contain minimum standards of construction, which have been developed over many years and cover all aspects of construction. Each requirement exists to prevent unsafe, unsanitary or deteriorating conditions in both residential and commercial buildings. The Building Department was formed in 1958. In 1998, a special revenue fund was established from the permit fees we collect, these monies are used solely to operate this department and ensures that the safety services we provide will be funded. There are no tax revenues in our yearly budget and every effort is made to keep fees as low as possible.

When is a permit required?

A building permit is required for new construction, alterations, additions, accessory structures, movement of structures, enlargement, change of occupancy, sign construction/replacement, swimming pools and demolition of structures. General maintenance and some types of projects do not require a building permit, i.e., painting, tiling, cabinets and counter tops, swings and play ground equipment, fences less than six feet in height. As always, it is best to call our office to see if your project requires a permit or if you have any questions on building in Mahoning County.

Current Building Codes

The current building codes for both commercial and residential construction are the 2007 Ohio Building Code and the 2006 Residential Code of Ohio, respectively. We review, permit and inspect all new, remodeled and existing buildings ensuring that they are constructed and used in accordance with the above State of Ohio mandated codes.
